I'm writing to confirm that we do not have any record of any deed being made in regards to this park here (Fields in Trust being the operating name of the NPFA).

I have also checked the relevant archives held here at our office and found no reference at all to any deed or covenant being placed on this land by the NPFA.

We would therefore hold that this land was first protected with us when the town council entered into a deed of dedication in 2016, commemorating the park as a Centenary Field.
