**The project is to organise voluntary litter picking working parties in Leighton Buzzard and the countryside around it. This will provide a more attractive environment for residents, encourage outdoor activity, and prevent pollution. Sadly there is much litter around Leighton Buzzard, as is visible from any walk around the town and local footpaths. It is on land managed by public, private and charitable sectors. Our activities would supplement the activities of local authorities who tend to concentrate resources in areas with the most public traffic. The success of the project can be assessed by taking before and after photos and by counting up the bags of litter collected. The project will enable the purchase of at least 15 litter pickers, 15 hi-vis vests and 60 gloves. The project is to organise voluntary litter picking working parties in Leighton Buzzard and the countryside around it. This will provide a more attractive environment for residents, encourage outdoor activity, and prevent pollution. Sadly there is much litter around Leighton Buzzard, as is visible from any walk around the town and local footpaths. It is on land managed by public, private and charitable sectors. Our activities would supplement the activities of local authorities who tend to concentrate resources in areas with the most public traffic. The success of the project can be assessed by taking before and after photos and by counting up the bags of litter collected. The project will enable the purchase of at least 15 litter pickers, 15 hi-vis vests and 60 gloves. It is intended to notify the organisations responsible for managing the land where litter is to be collected before each litter clearing party. The Town Council has kindly allowed Council premises to be used as a collection pick up point for litter bags to be collected by Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) in the past and it is hoped that this will be able to continue. Litter picks will be risk assessed and litter collectors briefed on the risks at the start of each litter pick. Large items (bigger than a black sack) will generally not be collected but reported to CBC or the landowner as flytipping. Any syringes found will not be collected but reported to CBC or the organisation managing the land. The activity is not suitable for children under the age of 12 and children over this age must be accompanied by a responsible adult. South Beds FoE are insured for this activity. Non-members of South Beds FoE are insured to take part in litter picking organised by the group.**

**We wish to buy a gazebo to allow us to provide Dr Bike services at locations other than the market. We ran five Dr Bike sessions on the market as part of Cycling UK's (CUK) Big Bike Revival (BBR) national project during lockdown. These were more successful than we anticipated. We were the only BBR project in a 30 mile radius. Covid-19 required us to change to way we delivered Dr Bike and some of these changes we will retain as they contributed to the success e.g. pre booked tickets and a very focussed offer. We are also providing two Dr Bike sessions on the market during Bike Week 2021 using the same format. We have provided Dr Bike alongside cycle promotion at May Fayre and the Linslade Canal Festival since 2006 using a mixture of borrowed and Buzzcycles owned gazebos. Our previous gazebo was destroyed by high winds at the 2018 Canal Festival and we have borrowed a gazebo from the Wildlife Trust since then courtesy of our previous Secretary Esther Clarke. Esther is now moving for work to Herefordshire so we need to source a new gazebo of our own. We would like to continue provide Dr Bike at the May Fayre and Canal Festival as well as at other locations around the town closer to where people live so it's easier for people to bring their bike along. The success of the project will be measured by the number of people who bring their bikes to Dr Bike. CUK is offering small grants for further BBR events between May & December 2021. We will be applying for a grant to cover running costs such as market stall rent, PPE and spare parts.**

Our learners are a variety of ages - children, young people and middle to late middle age. Although we have not been able to play publicly over the last year we have recorded concerts which will also be accessible on the website for those who are physically unwell and not able to get to a concert in person to enjoy.**
