4	Utilise the town's waterfronts for a recreational development and support inclusion of a small canal boat marina/quay	Big Plan II 2010	2012 Development Brief for land at Bridge Meadow but land not in local authority ownership. Potential for marina development by A505.			
5	Continue to promote improvements to available hotel accommodation.	Big Plan II 2010	The Swan Hotel refurbished and reopened in 2011. Possibility of hotel inclusion on land south of the High Street development.			
6	Provision of a Tourist Information Centre in the town centre.	Big Plan II 2010	Interim solutions include leaflet racks at Library and multi-storey car park.  Town centre free WiFi launched 2020 will provide visitors with fast and free access to information.

11	Continue to support the implementation of flood protection measures for Clipstone Brook.	Big Plan II 2010	Measures implemented by the Environment Agency and flood risk has been downgraded. Situation to be monitored, particularly given the development on land east of the town.
12	Support the provision of local school facilities	Big Plan II 2010	Central Bedfordshire Council has statutory responsibility and is developing a Schools For the Future programme.  Potential change from 3-tier to 2-tier school system under consultation.

21	Leighton-Linslade Green Wheel	Council resolution 30/9/2019 & Big Plan II 2010	A long term partnership ambition through the Ouzel Valley Park Steering Group, the revised Green Wheel Masterplan is currently under consultation.  LLTC purchased Peace Meadow to secure this green space.		
22	Restoration of Henry Finch Memorial Fountain in Linslade Recreation Ground	Council resolution 30/9/2019	External funding was sought as part of the 2018/19 improvement programme for Linslade Recreation Ground, but was unsuccessful.		
23	Secure a new leisure centre as part of the development to the East of the town	Big Plan II 2010	The Principal Authority through its Leisure Strategy is working toward the delivery of a commensurate level of appropriate facilities sufficient to meet existing and future need.		
24	Provision of clubhouse and launching site for Canoe Club	Big Plan II 2010	No suitable site or funding has as yet been identified.		
25	Continue to search for a suitable site for a club quality athletics track & facilities	Big Plan II 2010	The Principal Authority by way of its Leisure Strategy is aware of this aspiration. Any future leisure centre site should where possible include provision for athletics.

35	Healthcare provision	Big Plan II 2010	The Plan outlines the wish for a community hospital and an increase in the number and capacity of GP Practices to keep apace with the town's growing population.  The CBC East of Leighton Linslade Framework Plan identifies land for potential healthcare facilities and the 2015 CBC Infrastructure Plan identifies a project cost for a GP surgery. The size and location of said facility is the subject of on-going work by delivery partners. The Framework Plan also makes reference to the Big Plan and its successor document.  LLTC has formed a Health Services Task and Finish Group to encourage progression of healthcare provision proposals to meet the ever-growing needs of the town and its surrounding area. Once the group has agreed its objectives, these will then be shared with the relevant delivery partners.  The future provision of a healthcare facility/hub has been an agenda item on previous Partnership Committee meetings and remains a town wide priority.
